Track Descriptions:

Environmental and Occupational Health—Students looking to pursue careers in epidemiology, public health biostatistics, public health research, environmental health and safety, occupational health and safety, and similar professions will learn about industrial hygiene, health and safety hazards and hazard management, environmental risk assessment, behavioral safety, environmental microbiology, health intervention strategies, federal regulation agencies, and public health preparedness and hazard response.

Health Behaviors—Students looking to pursue careers in applied public health practice, public health education, public health promotion, community outreach and assessment, social and behavioral sciences, and similar professions will learn about health education methods, health promotion and intervention strategies, community services, cultural humility, relationship violence, substance abuse and treatment, human sexual behavior and sexual education, and the impacts of sociocultural differences on public health.

Health Deliveries—Students looking to pursue careers in alternate health professions (such as pharmacy, nursing, medicine, therapy, etc.), healthcare administration, healthcare policy, public health management, and similar professions will learn about the economics of healthcare and healthcare reform, hospital management and administration, health policy, biological research, biomedicine, the identification and treatment of mental health issues, organizational assessment and planning, and public health marketing.
