## Before You Arrive

### ACCEPT OFFER OF ADMISSION

After you have been officially admitted, the UA Graduate College will send you your Student ID number by e-mail and your PIN by mail. Log into UA GradApp to accept your admission (indicate your intent to matriculate).



### SET UP NETID/EMAIL

Using your student ID and PIN, you will set up your NetID at this link.

Use your NetID and password to login to:

- Catmail: You should begin checking your e-mail for official communication from the UA and College of Public Health
- D2L: Classes may not appear until the 1st day of classes
- UAccess: Login to the Student Center to register for classes, sign up for health insurance, view your financial aid, etc.

### MEET STUDENT IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT

The University of Arizona requires proof of measles and mumps (MMR) vaccination for all students. You will need to meet this requirement before you can register for classes.

### PURCHASE HEALTH INSURANCE

The University of Arizona offers one major health insurance policy designed specifically for eligible University of Arizona students and their dependents. International Students: The University of Arizona requires that all international students carry the Student Health Insurance unless you qualify for an exemption. Exemptions must be requested each semester.



### GET STARTED WITH ORIENTATION

- Participate in online orientation, which will be available in early August.
- RSVP for on campus orientation. Instructions will be sent over the summer.
- Items to bring: driver's license and social security card
- International students: bring I-20 paperwork, Visa, and MMR immunization records



### PAY FOR TUITION AND FEES

# After You Arrive

### GET YOUR CATCARD

Visit the CatCard office located on main campus on the lower level of the Student Union to have your picture taken and pick up your student ID card. Make sure to bring a government or state issued photograph identification as well as your student ID number. There is a \$25 charge for your CatCard. Phoenix-based MPH students will have their CatCard photos taken at orientation



### PREPARE FOR CLASSES

#### ATTEND ORIENTATIONS
